Answer:

- 1301. The Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) has five full-time staff employed within its Media and Communications team located in Sydney. Media and Communications is responsible for internal and external communications, answering public enquiries, media liaison and corporate publications, such as APRA's Annual Report and *Insight*. The team comprises:
 - Head of Media and Communications;
 - Senior Communications Advisor;
 - APRAinfo Manager;
 - Media and Communications Coordinator; and
 - Desktop Publisher/Graphic Designer.
- 1302. APRA does not create non-ongoing positions. APRA fills roles either permanently or on a fixed-term basis.

- 1303. As at 10 February 2016 a contractor is employed to temporarily fill the vacant APRAinfo Manager role.
