2586. For the period 19 September 2015 to 19 February 2016, total amount of \$11,228 was spent on legal costs as listed below.

2587. For the period 19 September 2015 to 19 February 2016, the AOFM spent \$304 on legal services provided by the Australian Government Solicitor for advice on the enterprise bargaining agreement. For the same period the AOFM spent \$10,924 on legal services provided by a private legal firm, Herbert Smith Freehills Pty Ltd. This comprised advice related to divestment of holdings in Residential Mortgage Backed Securities and advice relating to transmutation of stock. All legal costs were done on a time and materials basis, at an agreed rate, and billed accordingly.

2589. Legal advice obtained from the Australian Government Solicitor was on a limited tender basis. Other legal advice was via the Legal Services Multi User Listing. The legal costs for all legal advice obtained by the AOFM was done on a time and materials basis at an agreed rate and billed accordingly.
